AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 9-2-3 OF
THE FOREST VIEW VILLAGE CODE
TO PROHIBIT THE PARKING OF MOTOR VEHICLES ON
UNPAVED SURFACES

WHEREAS, Section 9-2-3 of the Forest View Village Code prohibits the stopping, standing, or parking of motor vehicles in specified places; and

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees find that the parking of motor vehicles on unpaved surfaces in the Village’s residential district, either on public property or private property, constitutes a nuisance and has an adverse impact on residential properties within the Village;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Forest View, Illinois as follows:

SECTION 1: Amendment. Section 9-2-3(A) of the Forest View Village Code is hereby amended by adding the following subsection 8 [new language in **bold**]:

9-2-3: STOPPING, STANDING OR PARKING PROHIBITED IN SPECIFIED PLACES:

Except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic, or in compliance with law or directions of a police officer or official traffic-control device, no person shall:

(A) Stop, Stand Or Park: Stop, stand or park a vehicle:

1. On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
2. On a sidewalk, or blocking more than two feet (2') of a sidewalk;

3. Within an intersection;
4. On a crosswalk;
5. Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic;
6. Upon any bridge or other elevated structure;
7. At any place where official signs prohibit stopping.

8. In a residential district, on any unpaved surface, either on public property or private property in front or side yards as defined in Section 10-2-2 of the Village Code.

SECTION 2: Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval, and publication as provided by law.
